- promoting sustainable use of natural resource
- improving decision making

Promoting Sustainable Use of Natural Resources 1

- celebrate successes of sustainable natural resource use projects
- quantify environment jobs to stimulate interest in environmental sector
- expand geothermally based vegetable, fruit and flower production for export
- establish challenge fund to stimulate locally-based projects

Promoting Sustainable Use of Natural Resources 2

- financial support from Iceland and Global Environment Fund for Landcare type measures for farmers' engagement in soil conservation
- formal scientific linkage with soil research interests in relevant institutions

Improving Decision Making: institutional

 establish Cabinet committee for implementation of the National Agenda 21 plan

- Cabinet to agree targets for delivery by key organisations
- Landgraedsla and Natturaverd to agree concordat
- merge Landgraedsla and Skograek

Improving Decision Making: processes

- formal decision making processes for large-scale projects using Strategic Environmental Assessment and Sustainable Development tests
- review experience of large-scale projects in remote areas from other countries
- employ environmental economists to devise appropriate methodology

Developing eco-tourism

- Cabinet level commitment for eco-tourism
- establish Icelandic Eco-tourism Association for project implementation
- 'approved' eco-tourism operators subscribing to Code of Practice
- · train and certify eco-tourism guides
- encourage joint working between organisations
- hold workshop on eco-tourism and invite experts from other countries

Extending environmental education

- Government agencies and NGOs provide materials for schools
- provide assistance to teachers by appointing environmental education advisors/coordinators

Promoting understanding of the environment

- stimulate production of geological brochures
- produce more up-to-date and comprehensive interpretation at key sites
- encourage the production of high-quality videos
- produce leaflets to explain soil restoration projects to visitors

Involving civic society

Government to establish new mechanisms for the effective involvement of civic society in the action on and monitoring of the 'Welfare for the Future' strategy
