Outcome from Jo'burg 2002

- Interdependent and mutually reinforcing integration of 3 SD elements through
- (1) Poverty eradication
- (2) Changing unsustainable production and consumption
- (3) Protecting and managing natural resource base of economic and social development

Poverty eradication

- Environmentally sustainable systems of agriculture, and other production
- Developing skills for managing natural resources
- Working with nature on flood alleviation
- Development of renewable energy

Changing unsustainable production and consumption

- Science-based assessments
- Methodology for internalising costs and measuring outcomes
- Integrated approach to policy
- Awareness raising and capacity building

Protecting and managing natural resource base of development

- development
 Integrated approach to resource management at appropriate scale
- Scientific understanding of resource management, including risks
- Reduction in loss of biodiversity
- Reduction in contribution to global warming

Strategies and structures for sustainable development

- 1. Comprehensive environmental strategy
- 2. Audit of sustainable development progress
- 3. Standing Orders for SD tests
- 4. New legislative SD duty
- 5. First Minister to retain SD lead
- 6. Separate environment and SD from rural affairs

Refocus public expenditure

- 1. Apply SD criteria to all public expenditure
- Apply Strategic Environmental Appraisal to programmes
- 3. Auditor General to review expenditure for social and environmental benefits

Economic sector policy and action shifts: energy

- 1. Stimulate R&D on all types renewables
- 2. Modify grid connection charges to stimulate renewables
- 3. Develop spatial renewables strategy
- 4. Intensify energy savings campaigns

Economic sector policy and action shifts: agriculture

- Shift cash support to environmental stewardship
- 2. Favour labour input over food output
- Develop contracts between society and farmers
- 4. Formal audit of use and value of agriculture cash

Education and the environment

- 1. Environmental citizenship in curriculum
- 2. Twin rural and urban schools
- 3. Establish environmental best practice sites
- More effort on public understanding of environment

Health and the environment

- 1. Implement responsible access provisions
- 2. More resources for path networks
- 3. Walking campaign for less healthy
- 4. Initiative on healthy diets

- 1. SSSI and NSA legislative change
- 2. New National Parks: sea and land
- 3. World Heritage status for Cairngorms and Flow Country
- 4. Positive cash to make them work
